ever, about a month ago, my innocence was stolen from me when a woman was shot on my block. That innocence will never be returned.

This is most unsettling. I have stopped my daily outside walks after 47 years out of an abundance of caution urged on by my younger male neighbors. And, there are few nights and even days that I go out of my house

Before COVID, I used to know most of my neighbors and the young men around here. I was block captain, a white hat, had a table out front for voter registration, and was known as the "Queen or First Lady," receiving respect from all who passed my house. (Most knew me as the Owner of The Legendary Blue Horizon). As the promoter, I always gave out tickets.

Many nights coming in very late, you would see many young men sitting on my steps with me. I felt if you were passing my front that time of the morning, you may be up to "no good." I would point a finger at them and call them to sit with me until dawn. I never had anyone to challenge me or walk away. I also had a policy I did not want you hanging on the corners when I came in from work late.

I spent years working with Commissioner Sylvester Johnson and Charles Ramsey, and Capt. Nicole McCoy. I usually attend police meetings. I have spoken with CO Gregory Riley, Capt Matthew Gillespie, P/O Baukman, and Sarg. Johnson.

As the former executive director of a domestic violence organization, I was recognized for my work in the violence field in the community and in City Council. Still today, I continue to be an advocate against violence in the community. However, I still want the freedom to walk comfortably in my own neighborhood.

The two agencies have already partnered for several years on parenting programs, respite shelters for young children and services for youth and young adults experiencing homelessness. "As a combined entity, we can better share our complementary programs and expand services by combining our resources and leveraging each organization's specialized expertise," said Gwen Bailey, Vice President of Programs at HopePHL. Bailey, led YSI as Executive Director since 2004 but first joined the agency in 1988.
